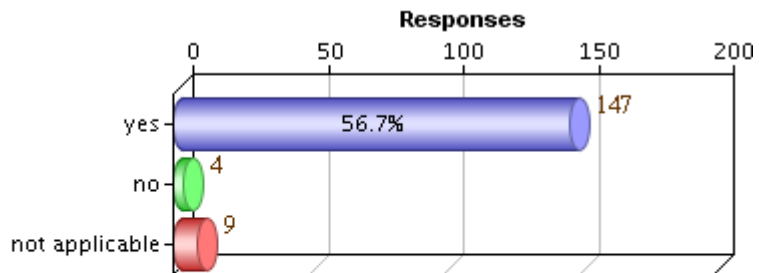


17. Do you feel we are taking grade appropriate steps to ensure proper knowledge and understanding of what the Catholic Church teaches?

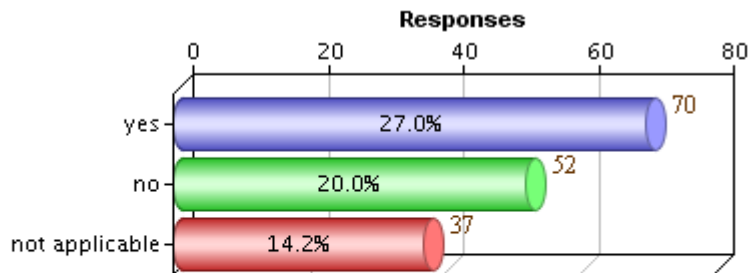

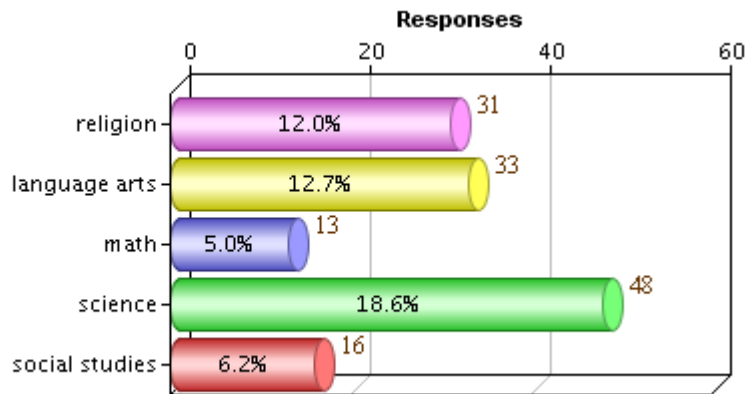

The Science is the weakest link in middle school. We are very dissatisfied with the lack of labs and application of study.

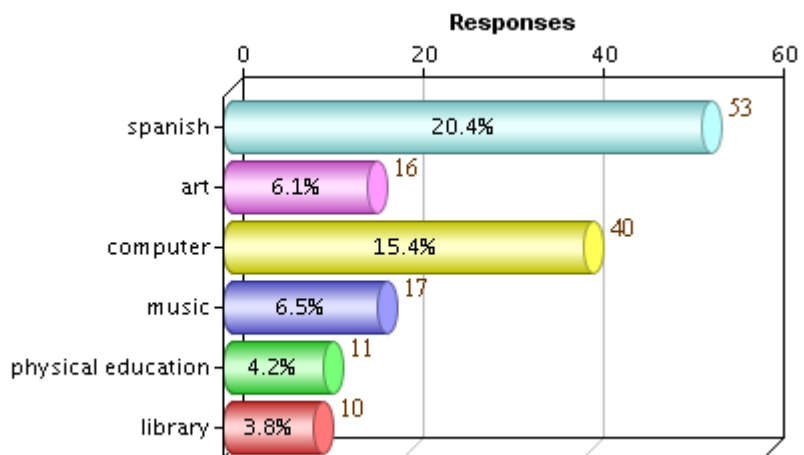

It is frustrating when your junior high student is repeating many of the same things your lower elementary student is doing. And, it's hard to learn a language without daily instruction.

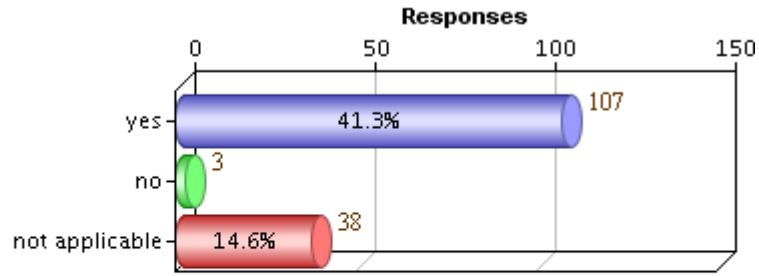

In an ideal world, the parish would be able to support its school fully so that every parishioner could be assured their children were being educated so strongly in the Catholic Church. Unfortunately, that isn't reality and not all schools are as firmly founded in teaching the faith as St. Thomas is.

No, I get much for my \$\$\$ than what I pay. I'm thankful, because I couldn't afford much more.

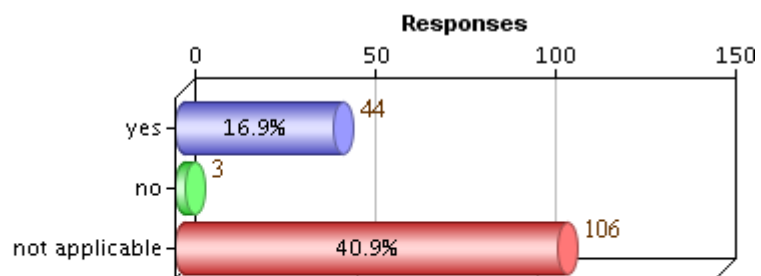

we appreciated during our time of need we were able to accept help.

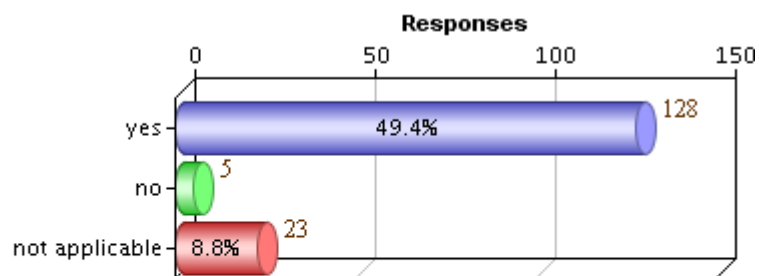

Teacher Ease has improved this year, a welcome site. Should continue this trend.

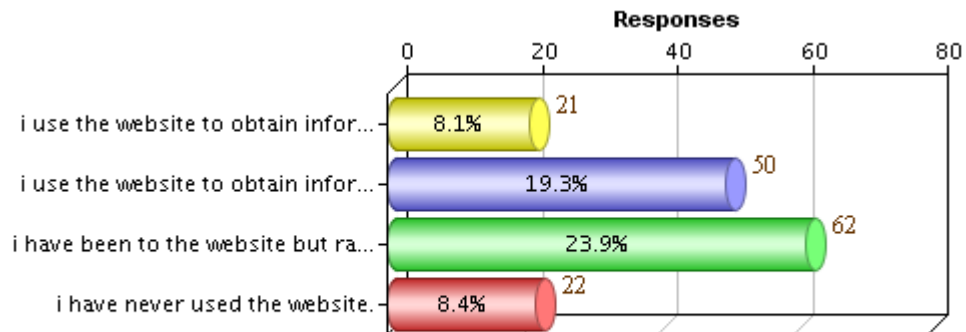

I would if more info was on it more often

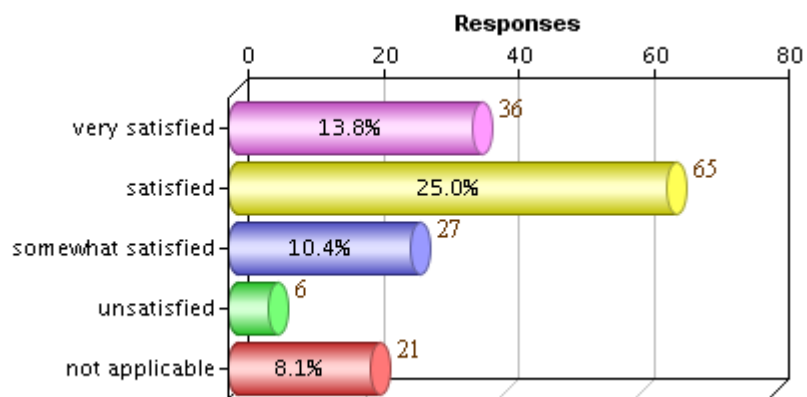

While Mrs. Lake and Mrs. Prindle do a great job, 26 first graders is too many.

I am glad we have been able to increase the size of Jr. High classes to 30 so that we don't have to turn so many away. As the kids are divided so many times due to their math groups anyway, this is not an unrealistic number.

1st grade is a little large

It would be nice to have more flexibility with class sizes. However, I am leary of an expansion project that might cause financial hardship and put our vibrant, flourishing school at risk.

We need more space by two classrooms

My son is in a very large class. He is doing fine, but if he were a child that had some extra needs I would be concerned with the size of his class.

I wish the school could handle 2 classes of each grade. It would be more equitable for families and students.

I feel that some class sizes are too large (over 22 kids in an early elem class) for the needs of all students to be met.

Classes are full and getting a bit more crowded than I would prefer.

I wish there was more room in some classes

as we encourage children with special needs to join the school community, class sizes must reflect the need for additional time, attention and resources for that child.

I think we need more space in order to have 2 classes of each grade and keep numbers down.

Unfortunately we are unable to grow which is a big disadvantage for our parish

Our Jacob would have been in that first grade "controlled growth" class which is way too big for first grade. We pulled him out as he needed some additional special services and needed to be in a classroom that was under 20 children. I would do away with that "one" class as it also causes the dynamics to never change among the children. He was the only African American child in the class and that didn't seem it would ever change.

wondering if we could go a little larger in class size, though

Adding classrooms/teachers to keep classes small but grow the school would be wonderful

The current 1st grade class is large for that age. I do, however, understand why this happened.

I don't feel parents ever really had a say in the size of a classroom; the Principal decided concerns with split classes, and the process of deciding who goes where.

I do not prefer split classes nor do I prefer having a single class that travels through the years (that is one class for that grade due to restrictions 'controlled growth?')

The "control" classes can get quite large. The other grades with 2 classes each is much more conducive to learning.

Would prefer that there were no split-grade classes
